Parish Council Tree planting-a message from Ingham Parish Council

As part of "The Platinum Jubilee celebrations of the late Queen Elizabeth 11", communities were invited to create a green legacy in honour of her service. "The Queen's Green Canopy" is a tree planting initiative which Ingham Parish Council, on behalf of the community, signed up to and applied for free trees from The Woodland Trust. 135 saplings have been received, and an area has been staked out in the south east corner of the playing field. This corner is a wet area and it is hoped that the trees, when planted, will help with the drainage as well as providing habitat for wildlife and contributing to the villages carbon capture. The trees are a long term project and it is today's children who will reap the benefit as they see them grow.

The Parish Council have invited children of the school to join them in planting a tree or two each during school time. We expect this to happen on 1st December and 7th December although dates may change depending on weather. Children will need wellies/old outdoor shoes (in a named carrier bag) on these days. This is a lovely thing for the children to take part in. A big thank you to the Parish council for asking us to help.

Tree decoration competition

Just a reminder that the judging of the Christmas tree decoration competition will take place on Thursday 1st December in the afternoon. Fillingham Christmas trees are kindly donating a tree to the school so we will be decorating it with the competition entries on the Friday. All entries will be sent home at the end of term. Please bring all entries in on Thursday 1st December. There will be 1st and 2nd prizes for each year group. We look forward to seeing the baubles and decorations on the tree.


