Wellbeing Day Two: Safe Relationships-Mrs Lovett

On Friday 4th November we all took part in the second of our whole school well-being days. The theme of the day was safe relationships. Throughout the day, we explored the difference between secrets and surprises, personal boundaries and seeking permission. The key aim of this PSHE day is to ensure the safety of our children by teaching them what they should do if something makes them feel uncomfortable. These are tricky, but important topics and it would be fantastic if you could continue the conversations at home. The NSPCC Pants are Private website is a fun way to start a conversation and uses resources which the children are familiar with.

Next week is National Anti-bullying week and Road Safety week. These topics will be covered within our whole school assemblies and in class. Look out for next Friday's homework which will be based on staying safe on our roads.

We meet in the Community


Room after school and start with a biscuit and a drink to get energy levels up.
